This Week with the Saints

Monday, August 7 – St. Sixtus II, Pope – Sixtus was arrested while saying Mass in a cemetery. Martyred along with several deacons by Emperor Valerian, I, his name is included in the Roman Canon.

Tuesday, August 8 – St. Dominic, Priest – Founder of the Order of Preachers (the Dominicans), Dominic worked tirelessly to spread devotion to the rosary and sound theological preaching to combat heresy.

Wednesday, August 9 – St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross, Virgin and Martyr – Born Edith Stein to a Jewish family, she completed her studies in philosophy. She converted to Catholicism after reading the works of St. Teresa of Avila and became a Discalced Carmelite. Since Sr. Teresa Benedicta was a Jewish convert, she was transported to Auschwitz, where she died in 1942.

Friday, August 11 – St. Clare, Virgin – Born in Assisi, Clare followed the example of St. Francis and founded an order of nuns dedicated to lives of poverty and charity.

Saturday, August 12 – St. Jane Frances de Chantal, Religious – Jane Frances de Chantal was a Christian wife and mother of six children. After her husband's death, she devoted herself to caring for the poor, founding the Visitation Order with St. Francis de Sales.

SPIRITUAL REFLECTIONS

Happiness Attacks

When I was a little girl, I experienced “happiness attacks”. At least that’s what I called them. They were fleeting moments when everything seemed right in my world: my parents loved me, my siblings were fun, I was doing well in school, or my uncle gave me two quarters. These attacks continued even as an adult: a student had an amazing insight into a piece of literature, a colleague was exceptionally kind, the words of a paragraph I was struggling with suddenly fell into place.

In today’s readings, people seem to be having happiness attacks all over the place. Daniel describes God’s glory and kingship – exuberantly. Peter shares the essence of Jesus’ own happiness: hearing God call him, “my Son, my Beloved”. And in the Gospel, Peter, James, and John are so happy they want to stay with Jesus on the mountaintop and prolong the euphoria forever.

What can we learn from all of this? God’s presence in our lives is often hidden. But at particular moments, God’s beauty or goodness or love breaks through the surface of our everyday. Such “attacks” might not last long, but they serve as gentle reminders that God is working just beneath the surface of observable reality. And amid the trials, misunderstandings, and ambiguities of daily living, God is there, saying to each of us, “You are my beloved son, my beloved daughter.” And such divine affirmation helps to sustain us, as it did Jesus, in our hard work of selfless loving.
