Annual Mission Co-op Appeal – Rev. Luis Carlos DeLeon will be speaking at all masses the weekend of August 4 / 5, 2018 describing the work of and requesting support for his society, the *Missionary Fraternity of Mary of Guatemala*. He has been invited to our parish by the mission office of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia.

Begun in 1981 as a youth ministry with seven young men, the Fraternity was subsequently established as a Society for Apostolic Life in 1990. Since then it has grown to over 150 ordained priests serving 64 missions in 31 dioceses in 11 countries. Currently there are approximately 100 seminarians in various stages of formation at the seminary in Guatemala.

Fraternity mission sites are established where there are no clergy available to fulfill pastoral needs, in difficult economic areas, and among the poor and marginalized. Fraternity priests journey to develop their spiritual lives and strengthen their Catholic faith to help them positively impact the community or village in which they live.

Blessed Among Us

St. Hedwig of Poland – Queen (1374-1399) – St. Hedwig was the daughter of Louis, King of Hungary and Poland. At the age of one she was betrothed to Wilhelm, the five year old heir to the grand duchy of Austria. When she was eight, however, her father decided prior to his death, to appoint Hedwig his successor. This caused much political turmoil. Before accepting her as their monarch, the Polish nobles insisted that she marry Jagiello, grand duke of Lithuania and Ruthenia. Though Wilhelm protested, Hedwig and Jagiello were married, and she was declared “king” of Poland (indicating that she ruled in her own right, not simply as a consort).

The Hapsburg court did not concede graciously. Rumors were spread throughout Christendom that Hedwig and Wilhelm had consummated their marriage and that she was an adulteress and bigamist. Such calumny stung, but in time Hedwig’s reputation as a Christian monarch was widely recognized. She endowed many churches, monasteries, and universities as well as a “college of psalmists” in the Cathedral at Krakow – a team of priests who took turns to sing the psalms twenty-four hours a day.

Hedwig died on July 17, 1399, four days after giving birth. Pope John Paul II over saw her beatification in 1986 and her canonization in the Cathedral of Krakow in 1997.

“Today we wish to kneel with you, Hedwig, at the feet of the Crucified One, to hear the echo of that lesson of love which you listen to. We wish to learn from you how to put that lesson into practice in our time.”

SPIRITUAL REFLECTIONS

The Crux of the Call

Jesus sent out his apostles to expel unclean spirits. We can have a whole discussion about what some of the “unclean spirits” might be today. However, that is not the crux of the message, I believe. Jesus did not tell his apostles to walk only during the day (and we know Bible stories about robbers, murderers, and foreigners being attacked because they are not welcomed in strange lands, so we cannot suggest that there was not risk in their time). Jesus did not tell his apostles to go armed for protection, or to take their bank cards in case they needed to stay at an inn, or needed money. He said, “Take nothing for your journey.” Trust was his message. “If you believe that what you are doing is right and you are following me and my call, then trust.”

However, we must remember that Jesus also did not say, “Stay at home, live right, take care of your family and trust in me.” He call us to go out – in communities, in teams (they were sent out in twos) – and preach repentance, and work for peace and justice. The Christian call is to build the Reign of God right here on Earth. All of us. Period.

Are we all called to leave everything behind but the clothes on our backs, with not even an extra pair of shoes? (What if it rains?) Probably not. But I hear Jesus saying, “Get out of your comfort zone and be a neighbor. Get involved with your neighbors, and your brothers and sisters.” I believe that each of us can do that – we need to listen in prayer and to our community members and loved ones to know what God is calling us to do.

Open your heart, get out of your comfort zone, and listen for God’s call!
