Blessed Among Us

Blessed Joan of Orvieto – Third order Dominican (ca. 1264-1306) Joan, who was born to a peasant family, lost both her parents when she was only five. Yet she expressed no fear. Pointing in church to an image of a guardian angel, she exclaimed: "He will look after me." She was adopted by relatives in Orvieto, and learned to support herself as a dressmaker. But when in time they arranged for her to get married she ran away and joined a community of Third Order Dominicans. The rest of her life was devoted to prayer and service of the poor.

Joan won a reputation for her visions and other super-natural gifts. While meditating on the Passion or the sufferings of the martyrs, her body would enter fully into the scene she was witnessing. When this occurred in the chapel, her superior would invite the public to serve as witnesses – a source of intense embarrassment to Joan. One time someone in the street upbraided her. When it became known that Joan's response was to offer a thousand prayers for this person, it came to be said that the best way to benefit from her prayers was to insult her.

She predicted that miracles would follow her death, which occurred on July 23, 1306. She was beatified in 1754.

"Many people testified that a fire was often seen during the night on the top of the roof of the house in which the holy virgin lived. When a household member asked her in a friendly way about the apparition of the fire, she immediately replied with a joyous and firm voice, 'It is God.'"

SPIRITUAL REFLECTIONS

Let's Talk About Sheep

The prophet Jeremiah reminds us that one of God's key attributes is justice. So central is this aspect of our understanding of divine action and intention that "justice" is a fitting divine name. God wants leaders to model themselves in the pattern of divine justice. And God promises to raise up such leaders.

Jesus regularly draws on this prophetic imagery, famously referring to himself as the Good Shepherd while calling out unjust and merciless religious leaders in his time for being bad or unjust shepherds. Though a lot of attention is given to shepherds, I wonder what is expected of the sheep and what responsibility is expected of us who profess to follow the Good Shepherd. In other words, let's talk about sheep.

Too often we dismiss ourselves as "just sheep," as unimportant followers of the more important shepherd. But rather than considering ourselves as merely dispensable lemmings, that is, "just sheep," maybe we need to think of our vocation to be *just* sheep – those called to exemplify the justice demonstrated by our one, true Shepherd. To overlook our call as followers of Christ is to act as "sheep without a shepherd." But having been baptized into the life, death, and resurrection of Christ, we can walk confidently into the future, embracing our identity as images of the God of justice.

In this way, we demonstrate that not only does God promise to raise up leaders, but God also promises to raise up just sheep.
