**This Week with the Saints**

**SPIRITUAL REFLECTIONS**

**Sunday, July 23 – St. Bridget, religious –** Bridget was a devoted wife and mother in Sweden. After her husband’s death, she first undertook a life of asceticism and penance before founding a religious order. She was noted for her virtue and her mystical experiences.

**Monday, July 24 – St. Sharbel Makhluf, priest –** Sharbel was a Maronite monk who spent much of his life living as a hermit in complete silence.

**Tuesday, July 25 – St. James, Apostle, Feast –** One of the sons of Zebedee, he joined Peter and John as a witness to many of Jesus’ miracles, including the Transfiguration and the raising of Jairus’s daughter. He was martyred by Herod, making him the first Apostle to suffer this fate.

**Wednesday, July 26 – SS. Joachim and Anne, Parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Memorial –** Tradition gives the names of the Blessed Virgin Mary’s parents as Joachim and Anne. They are venerated for their daughter’s great virtue and her selection to be the mother of God’s Son.

**Saturday, July 29 – St. Martha, Memorial –** The sister of Mary and Lazarus. She cared for Jesus and his disciples when they visited her home. When her brother Lazarus died, she expressed her faith that Jesus could raise him from the dead.

**Love’s Reach**

The crowd listening to these parables knows all too well that the mustard seed is an invasive weed. It is the last thing anyone wants in their field!

No one in their right mind would ever sow mustard seeds. Well...no one, unless you are God. Remember, in these parables Christ is describing God’s love. And like the sower who casts the mustard seeds that are rejected by most, this parable reminds us that God’s love encompasses all and reaches even those that are rejected...those who are on the fringes...those who are broken. God’s love reaches the divorced, the gay, the depressed, the homeless, the jobless, and the addicted. Our personal weeds grow together with our wheat. But no matter how many mustard seeds we have, God’s love reaches each of us and fills us with forgiveness. And the best news yet? It is freely given by God to all of us and can’t be earned. There is nothing we can do more of or less of in order to gain more favor or more love from God. All we are called to do is to be open to this incredible gift of God and, in turn, to reach out to others with this same love.

But all too often, as we are reminded in the parable of the wheat and the weeds, we allow our egos to take over. We focus on what we want and what we think, based on our own reference points, judging who are the worthy and unworthy – rejecting others, rejecting ourselves, and thus rejecting God.
