Blessed Among Us

St. Juliana Falconieri – Founder, Sisters of the third Order of Servites (1270-1341) – Juliana, who was born to a wealthy family in Florence, was raised largely by her uncle, one of the founders of the Order of Servites. Inspired by his example, and with his consent, she was accepted at the age of fifteen as a Third Order Servite while continuing to live at home with her mother. Upon the latter’s death Juliana moved into a community with a group of other women, which in time was recognized as a separate order, the Sisters of the Third Order of Servites. Following a simple rule, they dedicated themselves to prayer and charitable work among the poor and sick. Juliana served as superior until her death in 1341.

St. Juliana was greatly devoted to the Eucharist. As she was dying, unable to receive communion, she asked that the Host be placed on her breast. At that moment she expired and the Host disappeared. Its image, it was said, was found imprinted over her heart. She was canonized in 1737.

“O faithful bride of Jesus and humble servant of Mary, Saint Juliana, thou who...didst merit to be fed miraculously with the Bread of Angles in thy last agony; obtain for me the grace to live a holy life in the exercise of every Christian duty and to be able to receive at the moment of death the comfort of the holy Sacraments in order to come with thee to the blessed happiness of heaven. Amen.”

SPIRITUAL REFLECTIONS

As God Remembers

It’s surprising how memory works, how the most insignificant of moments can stick with us, allowing us decades later to return to the place and time and remember it as if it were yesterday. As if it somehow matters.

Like the time when I was about four, no more, and my mom was talking to her sister on the phone – when phones were on walls, and attached by cords, and anyone with ears to hear could hear what was said. And what do I remember about this particular conversation? Mom’s final words: “I better let you go. I hear your baby crying in the background.” (What were you expecting? Something memorable?... “I better let you go. We haven’t told the kids yet, but we’re taking them to Disneyland, and I really must start packing.”)

Why would my ears perk up at the mention of a baby crying in the background? Quite simply, because I could picture a baby crying in a crib. Or a baby crying in a bedroom. But what in the world, or where in the world, was the “background”? Sometimes preschoolers like to know these things. “What’s a background?” I asked Mom after she “let Polly go.” And she explained it to me in words I was able to understand. *Background*. I learned a new word, while my hungry little cousin no doubt was already being fed.

Lest we forget, there are hungry little ones in the background of today’s Gospel too. The *anawim* – the humble of the earth, the lowly and poor. Jesus was one of them. He’d have learned that as a child, listening to Mary sing her *Magnificat* day in and day out, as surely she must have. “Mom, who are the lowly? How will God lift them up? How will God scatter the proud in their conceit? And what does *scatter* mean anyway?” How could a mother tell her tender child that he himself was the one – Word answer to all those questions? (Probably not: “You’re it! Though I know not how. Go ask your Father.”)

Decades later, Mary would “let Jesus go” to begin his public ministry. He did so insisting that in the Kingdom of God, no person is ever relegated to the background, most especially the poor and lowly. He knew that there was no better way to “scatter the proud in their conceit” Than to “scatter the see” of his word on hearts far and wide. He knew that just one seemingly insignificant word – pick a word, there are so many to learn – would have the power to make us suddenly remember as God remembers.

We’re it? Smallest of seeds though we are, we’d better go. God’s people are crying in the background, and they really matter.
