This Week with the Saints

Sunday, November 12 – St. Josaphat, Bishop and Martyr – Josaphat was a bishop of the Church in Ukraine. He sought ardently to improve the education of priests and the unity of the Church. He was martyred by an axe-blow.

Monday, November 13 – St. Frances Xavier Cabrini, Virgin - Often called “Mother Cabrini,” Frances Xavier Cabrini was the first U.S. Citizen to become a saint. She immigrated to the United States in 1889 to serve the growing immigrant population. She and her sisters founded many social service institutions, including hospitals and orphanages.

Wednesday, November 15 – St. Albert the Great, Bishop and Doctor of the Church – Albert the Great was both a great theologian and a great scholar, showing the compatibility of faith and reason. His works discussed faith, philosophy, and the sciences. Thomas Aquinas is counted among his students.

Friday, November 17 - St. Elizabeth of Hungary, Religious – With the consent of her ruler husband, Elizabeth spend much of her married life providing for the needs of the poor. After his death, she divested herself of her possessions and lived a life of prayer and poverty, attending to the sick in a hospital she had established.

SPIRITUAL REFLECTIONS

With Lamps Burning Brightly

The lamps you will light prefigure that great procession of lights in which we shall go to meet the Bridegroom with the bright lamps of faith, our souls radiant and pure. Very careful shall we be not to fall asleep, in case the awaited One should arrive unexpectedly. Nor shall we come without the oil of good works, for fear of being excluded from the bridal chamber.

I see with my mind’s eye the misery of such a disaster. On the Bridegroom’s arrival a loud cry will summon the wise, who will go forth to meet him with their lamps burning brightly, being amply supplied with fuel; while the others, un utter confusion, will belatedly go to the storekeepers for some oil. Swiftly the Bridegroom will enter and the wise will go in with him, but the foolish will be shut out because when it was time to enter they were still busy preparing themselves...

There is no place in heaven for the arrogant and careless, nor yet for one dressed in rages instead of a wedding garment (cf. Mt 22-11-14), even though while on earth such a one may think himself fit for the resplendence of the world to come and, deceived by vain hopes, slip in among the faithful without their knowledge.

What will the next world be like? Once we are within, the Bridegroom knows what he will teach the souls that have entered with him, and how he will be united with them. I believe that he will live with them and teach them yet higher and holier mysteries. May we ourselves have a share in that life; both we who impart this teaching and you who receive it, in Christ himself, our Lord, to whom be glory and power for ever. Amen.

Gregory of Nazianzus (ca. 330-ca.389) was Archbishop of Constantinople and is perhaps best known for his defense of the doctrine of the Holy Trinity against the heresy of Arianism.
