**SPIRITUAL REFLECTIONS**

**Thursday, November 9 – The Dedication of the Lateran Basilica – The Basilica of St. John Lateran Hill in Rome is the cathedral church of the Bishop of Rome, the pope. As such, it is considered the mother church of the whole Catholic Church. This feast is celebrated throughout the Latin Church as a sign of the whole Church’s unity with the Holy Father. It replaces the Mass of the day when it falls on Sunday.**

**Friday, November 10 – St. Leo the Great, Pope and Doctor of the Church – Leo the Great served the Church as pope in the fifth century. In his sermons, he preached the faith with great passion and integrity. He defended the faith against errors and increased the unity of the Church while helping to protect it from the barbarian invasions.**

**Saturday, November 11 – St. Martin of Tours, Bishop – Martin of Tours gave up his life as a soldier to embrace the Christian faith. He lived as monk before becoming bishop of Tours in France. He was known for his pastoral care of his people and his great generosity to the poor.**

**Practice, Practice, Practice**

Were I to leave this earth today, and were you to ask me for a final word about what our ideal is. I would have to say, certain that it would be understood in its deepest sense: “Be a family”.

Are any among you approaching their final moments of life? Imagine you are in their place, and do for them what you would want done for yourself, until their very last breath.

Are any of you rejoicing because of a success, or for any other reason? Rejoice with them, that their consolation may not fade and their hearts not close, so that their joy may belong to everyone.

Are some moving to another place? Do not let them leave without filling their hearts with a single inheritance: the sense of a family, so that they may take it with them wherever they go.

Never place any kind of activity, whether spiritual or apostolic, before the spirit of being a family with the brothers or sisters with whom you are living.
