BLESSED AMONG US

Annalena Tonelli – Servant of the Poor (1943-2003) Annalena Tonelli studied to become a lawyer in her native Italy. But from an early age she felt a deep calling to serve “the poor, the suffering, the abandoned, the unloved.” In 1969 she moved to northern Kenya to the town of Wajir. There, among a population of mostly ethnic Somalis, she taught school and later trained as a nurse. With support from the World Health Organization, she successfully developed a method for treating tuberculosis among nomadic peoples and also founded a school for the deaf. In 1984 the Kenyan army launched a war against a Somali clan in the Wajir region. Tonelli helped expose atrocities committed by the military. As a result, she was expelled from the country. She settled in Somalia, where she resumed her work with TB patients and later with those suffering from HIV/AIDS.

Tonelli largely worked on her own. She embraced a “radical poverty” with no possessions apart from a change of clothes, “without a name, without the security of a religious order, without belonging to any organization.” She said she did it for Jesus Christ, who asks us to give our lives for our friends. In the end she did give her life. After nineteen years in Somalia, she was assassinated by unknown gunmen on October 5, 2003. No motive was ever discovered.

“[Those] who count for nothing in the eyes of the world, but so much in the eyes of God...have need of us, and we must be with them and for them, and it doesn’t matter at all if our action is like a drop of water in the ocean. Jesus Christ did not speak about results. He only spoke about loving each other, about washing each other’s feet, of forgiving each other always.”

SPIRITUAL REFLECTIONS

When God Does Not Intervene

No one knows anything about Habakkuk except what is in his book. The political enemies on his horizon are the Chaldeans, a “fierce and impetuous nation” whose “horses are swifter than leopards, more menacing than wolves at dusk.” [Hab 1:6,8]. They seize dwellings not their own. They gather captives like sand. Apocalypse is right around the corner. But Habakkuk’s argument is not with them. His argument is with God. Why is God letting the bad guys win? What has happened to the God of justice? Habakkuk thought he knew who God was, but the Chaldean menace is messing with his head. The Divine Listener will not listen. The Divine Savior will not save. Meet cognitive dissonance, Circa 600 BCE.

Against all odds, Habakkuk decides to remain faithful even if God won’t. He stations himself on the rampart of his fortress and waits for God to answer his complaint. *How long!...*

When God finally answers him, the news is not good.

The Chaldeans are serving a purpose, God tells Habakkuk. Their arrogance will circle back on them, but that is not your business. Your business is to write the vision – to write it so plainly that even those who hurry by can read it. “For there is still a vision for the appointed time,” God says to Habakkuk; “it speaks of the end, and does not lie.” If it seems slow, wait for it. It is on its way; it will arrive right on time (2:3).

But what about the meantime (the *very* mean time)? The spirit of the proud “is not right in them,” God says, “But the righteous live by their faith” (V.4).

Lots of people think Paul said that, since it shows up more than once in his letters, but Habakkuk said it first...[B]efore Jesus and after Jesus, God’s people have always lived by faith – by continuing to do what they know is right, regardless of what the leopards and wolves are doing. At the same time, Habakkuk reminds us that the faithful do not cease to be faithful when they call God to account. Job did it. Jeremiah did it. Depending on how you read Jesus’ last words from the cross, he did it too.

The fact that these laments have ended up in Scripture tells us there is something sacred about them, something we need not fear doing ourselves.
